



Fall 2020 Overall Enrollment Down by 2.5% from Fall 2019




Fall 2020: 4-Year Institution Enrollment Change (%) from Fall 2019


One-Year % Change by Degree Level


Undergraduate Enrollment Change of Top Majors at Four-Year Institutions

Percentage Change from Fall 2019




Change in First-time Student Enrollment






UNC System Overall Enrollment Change Between Fall 19 and Fall 20

Factors that might have impacted Fall 2020 freshman enrollment

- National Association for College Admission Counseling changed rules regarding poaching
- ECU joined CFNC's College Application Week in 2019: waiving application fees between Oct. 21-25, 2019
- Board of Governors changed the minimum admission requirements: minimum weighted high school GPA of 2.5 OR a minimum SAT of 1010/ACT of 19
- Covid-19
 - Stay-in-place orders and limit in size of gathering
 - Unemployment, underemployment or other financial difficulties
 - Virtual yield events
 - Uncertainties around Fall 2020 re-opening








ECU Freshman Application and Matriculation



Summer Melt: 2019 and 2020


Due to different data reporting methods and timelines, the results from the Summer Melt analyses may be slightly different from ECU official data.



Definition of Summer Melt

- Enrolled: committed by paying an enrollment deposit and was enrolled on Census Day
- **Summer melt canceled**: committed by paying an enrollment deposit but informed the university of their decision not to attend
- **Summer melt did not cancel**: committed by paying an enrollment deposit, but did not inform the university of their decision not to attend
- Non-enrolled: did not commit and did not enroll












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Summary of Observations and Recommendations



Applicant Pool Overlap with ECU: Selected UNC Schools

Fall 2020 First-year Students by Institution (Ordered by % of the First-year Class Also Applied to ECU, from high to low)



1/3 of first-year students at UNC-Wilmington were also accepted by ECU.

This is an underestimate of applicant pool overlap because some of ECU's enrolled students may have also been accepted by UNC-W.

Observations Regarding Fall 20 Applications

- 2020 Applications and Yield: compared to Fall 2019
 - Total applications increased by 1,078 (5.6%); in-state applications increased by 1,798 (13%)
 - More applicants met ECU's minimum admissions criteria.
 - Total enrolled students dropped by 222 (5.1%); in-state students dropped by 219 (5.7%).
- 28% of accepted students applied to ECU through CFNC; many took advantage of the Free Application Week.
- Yield rate of accepted students:
 - ECU Website: 45%
 - Common App and CFNC: 21%
- Accepted students who applied very early or very late were more likely to enroll at ECU.



Observations Regarding 2020 Summer Melt

- Accepted students who paid a tuition deposit
 - Fall 2019 (n=4,835): 9.7% did not enroll on Census Day
 - Fall 2020 (n=4,774): 13.2% did not enroll on Census Day
- Summer Melters
 - The number of "Summer Melters" increased by 161 (34%) in 2020
 - More than half of the "Summer Melters" informed ECU before the fall semester began (57% in 2020)
- Orientation
 - 26% of 2020 Summer Melters attended orientation, compared to 19% of 2019
 Summer Melters.



2020 Summer Melters: Canceled vs. Not Canceled

- Summer melters who informed ECU:
 - 1. 35% minorities comparable to enrolled students
 - 2. Had comparable High School GPAs to enrolled students
 - 3. Had significantly higher family income than enrolled students
 - 4. Were less likely to be Pell eligible than enrolled students (11% vs 36%)
 - 5. 18% attended orientation
 - 6. Enrolled at another UNC institution (35%) or a NCCCS school (30%)

- Summer melters who did not inform ECU:
 - 1. 42% minorities higher than enrolled students
 - 2. Had lower High School GPA than enrolled students
 - 3. Had significantly lower family income than enrolled students
 - 4. Were less likely to be Pell eligible than enrolled students (30%)
 - 5. 38% attended orientation
 - 6. Did not enroll in a college (33%) or enrolled at a NCCCS school (30%)



Reasons for Summer Melt

- Financial burdens
- College transition challenges and lack of support:
 - Difficulty navigating a new and complicated process
 - Interpreting award letters and tuition bills
 - Complexity of federal financial aid applications and process of applying
 - Difficulty completing paperwork
 - Lack of and/or limited access to counseling/guidance
 - Not knowing whom to reach out to on campus
- And, of course, the "unexpected" such as COVID (maybe the primary reason for Fall 2020 melt, according to students, exacerbating financial burdens & transition challenges)



Possible Strategy – Connect & Communicate

(all of which are utilized by ECU UG Admissions & University Marketing)

- Engage with students early and continue to reach out to them proactively in the summer months.
- Utilize the power of technology, e.g., create digital messaging campaigns with reminders of important tasks and student resources; use social media to answer questions; etc.
- Be people first in your digital communication strategies by personalizing both messages and processes.
- Use "nudges" (personalized and timely messages to urge students to complete tasks and navigate processes).
- Continue to communicate the value of your institution and of a college degree.
- Connect (and maintain connection) with parents.



Possible Strategy – Simplify

 Simplify the acceptance and post-acceptance processes & reduce information overload.

 Provide students with a checklist of all the tasks they need to do over the summer to prepare for college but engage students with one focus at a time. (Provided to ECU students through PiratePort)



Possible Strategy - Support

- Engage current students by assigning them as peer mentors to incoming students.
- Create a social community where incoming students can connect with one another. (All new first-year students at ECU are invited to socially connect with other first-year students through the Class of 202X Facebook group.)
- Increase inter-campus collaboration to provide support and reassurance.
