

### **Students**

### Highlights

In the Fall 2008 semester:

- Total headcount enrollment was 27,677 including both on-campus and distance education students; an increase of 6% over the Fall 2007 enrollment of 25,990. Oncampus enrollment totaled 21,494; a 4% decrease under Fall 2007 of 20,720.
- > 81% of first-time freshmen were residents of North Carolina.
- 21% of undergraduate transfer students were from out-of-state; of the 78% coming from NC institutions 58% were from community colleges and 6% were from private senior institutions. The top-three-sending NC senior institutions were: North Carolina State University, University of North Carolina at Greensboro, and University of North Carolina at Wilmington, and; comprising 43% of in-state senior institution transfers.
- > 22% of all students were enrolled in Distance Education courses only.
- > 87% of ECU undergraduate students attended full-time; 34% of graduate students (excluding medical students) attended full time.
- > Ethnic minorities (including American Indian, Asian, Black Non-Hispanic, and Hispanic) made up 24% of the undergraduate students, 22% of the graduate students (excluding medical students), and 32% of the medical students.
- > 67% of on-campus students were North Carolina residents.
- > 16% of undergraduates were 25 or older.



First -Time Freshman Fall Enrollment History Average SAT Scores by Residence







### On-Campus and Distance Education Fall Enrollment Headcount History



### On-Campus & Total Full-Time Equivalent History






### Fall Enrollment History by Gender and Attendance Status








# Faculty & Staff

## Highlights

In the Fall 2008 semester:

- **ECU** employed 1,804 regular full-time and part-time faculty; an increase of 5% from the previous year.
- > 42% of the faculty were women.
- > 15% of the faculty were ethnic minorities.
- > 51% of the faculty were under the age of 50; the average age of faculty members of all ranks was 49.
- > 31% of the faculty had more than 10 years of service with the university, while approximately one-half (48%) have fewer than 6 years of service. The average length of service was 9 years.
- > 82% of non-administrative faculty (including temporary faculty but excluding SOM) were employed on a full-time basis, and 60% were tenured or on tenure track.
- The average salary for all faculty (excluding SOM), converted to a full-time, ninemonth salary equivalent, ranged from \$57,529 for instructors to \$96,331 for professors. The average salary for all ranks (instructor through professor) was \$76,580.
- > 34% of ECU's total workforce was faculty.
- > 24% of the total workforce was ethnic minorities.
- > ECU employed 3,016 (56%) women and 2,089 (36%) men.


## Full and Part-Time Faculty by Rank and Gender


## Full and Part-Time Faculty by Ethnicity


## Full and Part-Time Faculty by Age Interval


## Full and Part-Time Faculty Average Age by Rank and Gender


## Full and Part-Time Faculty by Years of Service



### Average Salary History for Full-Time 9-10 Month AAUP Faculty (Brody School of Medicine Excluded)






